We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Ludington Elementary School. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2022-23. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

 - a. Ludington Elementary School is the only elementary school in the district, serving students in grades PreK-5.

A team, composed of administration and lead teachers, developed the school improvement plan using multiple sources of data including state

 - a. Ludington Elementary School has no specialized schools. We participate fully with the West Shore Educational Service District in specialized programming and instruction when available and applicable.
