Dear 2A Virtual Families,

Congratulations on making it to the halfway mark of the 2020-2021 school year! We appreciate your patience and understanding as we continue to navigate through this unprecedented time. We wanted to take this opportunity to provide clarification regarding the pacing for Edmentum Calvert Learning.

For students in kindergarten through fifth grade, all courses are considered year-long courses. An ending date of June 9, 2021 has been given for each course, matching the last day of school for all LASD students. The pacing features within Edmentum are ensuring that you complete each course by the end of the school year. It is important to note that Edmentum includes Saturdays and Sundays, as well as LASD scheduled days off in the days remaining. This means that, on occasion, it may be necessary to complete more than one day's worth of work in a given subject area to remain on pace.

When reviewing progress for 2A students, we have to consider both the proficiency (course grade including quality of work) and pace (if your child is following the recommended pacing schedule). Please review the following chart that we used to determine your child's progress at the end of Trimester 1:

	4 - Progressing Above Grade Level Expectations	3 - Progressing at Grade Level Expectations	2 - Progressing Below Grade Level Expectations	1 - Not Progressing/Area of Concern
Proficiency	86%-100%	70%-85%	60%-69%	Less than 60%
Pace	0-5 Assignments Behind	6-10 Assignments Behind	11-20 Assignments Behind	More than 20 Assignments Behind

If your child is behind in certain courses, s/he will need to complete multiple assignments per day until you are back on pace. Starting now, we will be using a score of zero for skipped assignments or missing assignments. This will ensure that grades are reflective of the work submitted and progress made. Please see the back of this letter to learn how to determine if you are on track and how to look for retakes that may have been granted by Mrs. Rittner. Please know that Mrs. Rittner is available should you have any questions.

Again, thank you for all your hard work in helping us make this a meaningful learning experience for your child this year. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's report card, please contact the office.



• When you log into Edmentum, your dashboard should look like this. In the image below, you will see where it shows if your child is on pace, behind, or ahead. In this example, the student is 2 assignments behind in ELA, right on pace in Math, and 2 assignments ahead in Physical Education.



How do I know if my child has any retake assignments to complete?
